GETTING READY FOR MY VISIT

Before going to Pablo Center, I can:

- Take care of my personal needs.
- Pack anything I might need, such as water, snacks, sunglasses, phone, wallet with ID, fidgets, headphones, or other comfort tools.
- Prepare for social interactions by practicing conversations with ticket sellers, ushers, or concession workers.
- Call ahead to ask about busy times.
- Check the website for accessibility options.
- If I have a service dog, prepare a response in case people ask about them.
- Plan how I will get there (driving, biking, bus, or walking).
- Plan where I will park.
- Look online to see what exhibits or shows are happening.

Today, I am going to Pablo Center at the Confluence! It is a place where I can see theater performances, art galleries, and even take a class. The entrance is at the corner of Graham Avenue and Eau Claire Street.

If I bike: I can lock my bike at the rack to the left of the entrance.

If I take the bus: I can get off at the Barstow and Eau Claire stop.

If I drive: I can park on the street or in a nearby parking ramp.

In warm months, I might see kids playing in the splash pad fountains outside. These fountains light up at night. I will only get wet if I go near them.

Valet Parking: During ticketed events, I can pay to have someone park my car for me. If I have an ADA event ticket, valet parking is free.





ENTERING PABLO CENTER

When I arrive, I will enter through the glass doors into the lobby.

The lobby might be:

- Busy and loud.
- Quiet and echoey.

I can wear headphones if I need to block out noise.



GETTING MY TICKET

Buying Online:

I can buy digital tickets by visiting pablocenter.org/events

Buying in Person:

I can go to the Box Office on the left side of the lobby under the sign that says "OakLeaf Physicians Lobby." If there is a line, I may need to wait my turn. I can pay with cash, credit, or debit card.



ACCESSIBILITY ACCOMMODATIONS

The Pablo Center has accommodations that I can request at the Box Office including:

- Wheelchairs
- Hearing assistance
- Accessible seating

Sensory Kits:

These are free to borrow and include:

Sunglasses

Noise-reducing headphones

Earplugs

Fidget toys

When I am done, I will return the items I borrowed to the Box Office.

When I am ready for a show, I will need to get my ticket scanned.

GOING TO MY SEAT

- Staff members wearing black clothes will scan my ticket using a small black scanner with a red light.
- If I have a digital ticket, I can show it in the AXS app.
- If I need help, an usher can help me find my seat.

INSIDE THE THEATRE

When it's time for the show, I will go into the theatre.

The lights may be dim, and I might hear quiet music or voices as people find their seats.

An usher can help me find my seat if I need help.

Once the show starts:

The lights will go down.

The room will get quiet.

I may hear loud sounds, music, or see bright lights on stage.

It's okay to cover my ears or wear headphones if it feels too loud.

If I need a break during the show, I can leave the theatre and go to a quiet space.

It's okay to feel excited or nervous—everyone is here to have a good time.

During intermission (a break in the performance), I may hear a chime or announcement to return to my seat. The chime might be loud.





EXPLORING THE GALLERIES

Pablo Center has three art galleries, all free to visit:

Brady & Jeanne Foust Gallery — On the first floor, next to the Box Office.

James W. Hansen Gallery — On the first floor, near the elevator.

Laurie Bieze Gallery — On the second floor, near the elevator.

When visiting the gallery, I will:

- Be careful not to bump into other people or the artwork.
- Not touch the artwork unless a sign says it is okay.
- Keep my backpack or bag from accidentally knocking anything over.

In the Hansen Gallery, there is a cart with drawing supplies and books. I can borrow supplies while I am in the space. When I am done, I will:

- Return the supplies to the cart.
- Take my drawing with me if I made one.



USING THE ELEVATORS & STAIRS

Pablo Center has three floors.
Elevators are located on the first floor near Hansen Gallery.
If the elevator is crowded, I can wait for the next one.
Stairs are also available to reach the upper floors.

Third Floor: RCU Theatre balcony and restrooms.
Second Floor: Laurie Bieze Gallery, RCU Theatre balcony
entrance, and restrooms.



QUIET ROOM

If I need a break, I can go to the Quiet Room on the second floor.
To find it: Walk through the Laurie Bieze Gallery, then turn right into the hallway, Room 223.

Inside the Quiet Room, I can:

- Sit in a chair or lay on the floor.
- Dim the lights.
- Use a lamp.
- Use sensory tools from the cart.

This room is also available for mothers who are nursing or pumping.

RESTROOMS & WATER

First Floor Restrooms:

Near the Foust Gallery (left of the Box Office).

Near the Hansen Gallery (opposite end of the lobby).

Second & Third Floor Restrooms:

Located near the RCU Theatre entrances.

Family Restrooms:

Private restroom for use by anyone. Available with changing tables.

Water Fountains:

Near the restrooms for drinking or refilling a bottle.
