Wisconsin Shakespeare Festival

Welcome to Wisconsin Shakespeare Festival! Our developmental theatre program is focused on bringing both original and modernized interpretations of William Shakespeare's works to the stage; our mission is centered around a shared belief in the power of words and the stories they tell. Our exuberant celebration of brilliant theatre seeks to ignite a spark to empower and inspire artists, as well as enlighten and connect audiences and the community. Our festival works to engage the community we serve through our traditional mainstage productions, educational programming to K-12 students, supporting living playwrights and new works, and putting theatre "on the go" through our touring theatre outreach program.

In our first season in 2023, we brought *A Midsummer Night's Dream* to life on our stage, a reimagined scenic interpretation of Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London. It was a great success for us to be able to bring together talented performers from across the country with actors from our own Chippewa Valley backyard, working together as a collective to tell one of Shakespeare's most produced stories. Also onstage, we produced our first Improbable Fiction new works series, designed to bring new playwrights' works to the forefront of theatrical creation and invest in the artists of today and tomorrow.

The summer also included time spent with the next generation of aspiring artists through classes where students were provided the opportunity to expand their knowledge under certified teachers and theatrical professionals. The Merely Players, a collaborative project between aspiring thespians and professional actors, told original interpretations of Shakespeare's plays to residents of all ages, culminating in eight free public performances that helped to spread our message beyond the walls of Pablo Center at the Confluence.

Our other main focus in Season 1 was community-building. Through initiatives such as our Arts & Ideas discussion series, Industry Night reception, and more, we were able to bring together those in our community who care passionately about theatre (and those who perhaps don't...at least not yet!) to grow and learn from each other as well as share opinions and ideas on the future of theatre and the arts in our region.

In our inaugural season, WSF reached community members as audience members in the Jamf Theatre as well as through our engagement activities across the Chippewa Valley. In total, the Wisconsin Shakespeare Festival's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* played to 1,443 audience members, our touring Merely Players troupe connected with 257 community members, and 246 playwrights submitted new works with hopes of being selected to be produced and workshopped during our festival.

Without your partnership, the Wisconsin Shakespeare Festival could not continue our mission of serving the Chippewa Valley and aspiring artists through our programming. We invite you to join us in creating the magic on and off stage while building on William Shakespeare's legacy.

WSF Season 1 Numbers

1,984 local community members reached through our first season of programming:

- 1,443 audience members attended A Midsummer Night's Dream
- 257 patrons took part in a Merely Players performance
- 210 community members attended workshops, talkbacks, and other events
- 74 students took an education class with WSF

246 submissions of new works for our Improbable Fiction series

- 33 states represented
- 6 countries of origin

184 actor auditions submitted from performers living in 29 states
